Ministry of Primary and Secondary Education Deploys Starlink to Remote Schools in North Nias to Boost Educational Access

Jakarta, 7 July 2026 - The Ministry of Primary and Secondary Education (MoPSE) has launched the Partisipasi Semesta Pendidikan Bermutu/PSPB (Whole-of-Society Participation for Quality Education), a collaborative ecosystem designed to unify education initiatives across Indonesia. The movement aims to streamline aid and collaboration efforts, which previously operated in isolation, ensuring they are better targeted, aligned with school needs, and capable of delivering a broader impact. The platform brings together the government, the business and industry sectors, philanthropic institutions, civil society organizations, universities, the media, communities, international organizations, and individuals to support the improvement of Indonesia's education quality.

Minister of Primary and Secondary Education, Abdul Mu'ti emphasized that the spirit of participation stems from the belief that acts of kindness benefit both the giver and society. He noted that everyone has an equal opportunity to contribute, extending beyond financial or material assistance.

"It is not about how much we give others, but how meaningful our contribution is to them," Mu'ti said in Jakarta on July 7. "Therefore, we are opening our doors to anyone who wishes to participate through the Rumah Pendidikan (House of Education) platform."

He added that President Prabowo Subianto has authorized the ministry to build partnerships to support the implementation of the administration's priority programs (Asta Cita) through public participation, in accordance with statutory regulations. "Universal participation aims to meet existing needs, accelerate program implementation, and improve as well as expand educational access," he explained.

Mu'ti emphasized that cross-sector collaboration is vital, as many educational needs require multi-sectoral support. These include developing student talents and interests, enhancing teacher competency, strengthening character education, and creating safe, comfortable learning environments. "We continue to welcome partnerships with various parties, as this collaborative approach allows us to meet needs, accelerate progress, and upgrade and expand our programs," he said.

He also stressed that advancing education goes beyond physical infrastructure; it requires shifting mindsets and strengthening character. "What we are building is a mindset. What we are building is human character. Therefore, it requires input and care from various stakeholders," he said. "The identity and

caract of the Indonesian nation is gotong royong (mutual cooperation). Let us work together to achieve equitable, quality education for all, building a great and high-quality Indonesian generation,” he concluded.

Meanwhile, Secretary-General Suharti explained that the PSPB was established to address the fragmented nature of past education partnerships. “There are already extensive contributions to education, but they have been scattered, with each operating on its own track. As a result, this support does not always align with national priority needs,” Suharti said.

She shared that Indonesia has more than 447,000 educational institutions serving over 53 million students. However, approximately 2.92 million children remain out of school, while literacy and numeracy achievement levels still require serious attention. Given these challenges, Suharti pointed out that the government cannot improve education quality alone; it requires the collective effort of all components of the nation. The platform for universal participation is now available through the Rumah Pendidikan super-app under the Ruang Mitra (Partner Space) section, accessible at pspb.pendidikan.go.id.

“Education in Indonesia has always been a collaborative effort. The educational needs are massive and cannot be addressed by the ministry alone,” she said.

Also in attendance, the Chair of Commission X of the Indonesian House of Representatives (DPR RI), Hetifah Sjaifudian, welcomed the ministry's initiative to create a collaborative space through the PSPB movement. She noted that the movement serves as an essential foundation for building a sustainable ecosystem for public participation.

“What is being created is not just a program, but an ecosystem for participation. Shared solutions and collaborative spaces are being opened up not only to teachers, principals, schools, and local governments, but also to development partners. We believe this approach will strengthen the quality of our policies,” Hetifah said.

The launch event was attended by 58 education development partners from the business and industry sectors, philanthropy, civil society organizations, universities, media, communities, international organizations, and various other institutions. Their presence reflects a shared commitment to strengthening the collaborative ecosystem to provide quality education for all Indonesian children.

Moving forward, the ministry aims to develop a data-driven partnership system that matches school needs with potential contributors through a process of needs identification, support matching, implementation coordination, monitoring, and reporting. The collaboration will focus on digitalizing learning, rehabilitating
